

Dear Citizens:

I hope that you enjoyed your summer as much as I have. I spent a good deal of mine coaching our 5th annual basketball camp and meeting some of Culpeper's youngest citizens. I am so thankful of our camp volunteers, for they make these programs such a success. Look for my tennis camp in early fall. It is our continued dedication to the youngest residents of Culpeper that I wish to convev via this letter today.

Culpeper is a community that truly cares about our youth and we are lucky to have so many organizations that collaborate over the summer to serve those young people. The cancellation of these programs during the pandemic was a major concern to our Board Members. However, the resurgence of youth opportunities and their popularity encourages me that we are on the right track with our plans to construct a fieldhouse, build 4 Pickleball Courts, and provide field lighting for our 16 fields at the Culpeper Sports Complex. Everyone on our Board is very proud of these initiatives as they will create a hub of activity for everyone and a source of pride for our residents. I encourage you to reach out to your Board members to thank them for their support of these Parks and Recreation initiatives. The plans for these special facilities are being finalized and soon we will be looking for contractors to bring our vision to life. We would love to incorporate as many locally sourced materials as possible in this project. This is the time to reach out to find ways in which local industries can contribute to this important endeavor.

Near the site of the future fieldhouse, another important project has also been realized in the CTEC school. All of the schools in Culpeper are important to us, but nothing is more exciting than the opening of a brand-new school. Just thinking about the students who will be walking through the halls of our state-of-the-art Career and Technical School next week puts a smile on all of our faces. This school represents the collaborative spirit that is the heart of the Culpeper community and our desire to bring every opportunity possible to our rural county. Our current Board members and staff, and former Board members: Hansohn, Walker, and Fritz, are all very proud of this school. Many thanks to the School Board members and School staff for this collaborative effort.

Our fiber-to-the-home initiative is currently the most important project we have ongoing. This will provide opportunities for all of our residents. We are just weeks away from submitting a multi-million-dollar grant proposal to the State which will allow All Points Broadband, in partnership with Culpeper County, to construct a 490-mile fiber network in Culpeper County. We hope that everyone is excited for school to start next week. Returning to a full-time, in-person schedule is a gift when so many other countries around the world are still unable to return to pre-pandemic operations. "OUT with the OLD, IN with the NEW" Culpeper County Volunteer Fire Department (CCVFD) takes delivery of new Brush Truck



In April of this year, the Culpeper County Volunteer Fire Department took delivery of a Ford F-550 brush truck from Apparatus Solutions, located in Brandy Station, Virginia. The F-550 is equipped with a HMA Ultra High Pressure system, which is completely self -contained, and incorporates a state of the art fire suppression system powered by a gas engine. It is also equipped with a front spray bar that allows personnel to ride inside the unit and extinguish field fires quickly. This multi-purpose unit can be used on many types of fires, including fuel, dumpster, vehicle, structure, brush, and forest.

The F-550 replaces a 1975 F-250, fondly referred to as "The Beast" by our members. We were saddened to see this workhorse of a brush truck leave, having served the Department and the County of Culpeper for forty-six years. Its new home is in St. Cloud,

Minnesota. The new owner is very pleased to have this piece of Culpeper County V.F.D. history in his collection.

The Culpeper County Volunteer Fire Department is an all volunteer department that has proudly

served the citizens of Culpeper for over 97 years. Our purpose is to prevent the loss of life and control or reduce the loss of property by applying all of our professional knowledge and resources. We accomplish this through fire suppression, public education and professional development training. It is our number one priority to provide the best volunteer fire services to all citizens and visitors of Culpeper.




There will be live music on the midway each evening; bring a lawn chair and sit back and enjoy the music while helping support the Brandy Station Vol. Fire Dept.

THE PARKLET PROJECT: CREATING COMMUNITY SPACES ACROSS CULPEPER

Culpeper's vibrant downtown has long been its jewel, a place for both locals and tourists alike to shop, eat, and explore. The Town's uniqueness lies in its location—tucked away in the heart of Virginia's Piedmont region, yet easily accessible from any direction—and its combination of award-winning wine and craft beer, upscale boutiques and rare antiques, excellent cuisine, and outdoor adventure. It's a quintessential southern town filled with locals who love their home and tourists who love to make it home for the weekend.

When the COVID-19 global pandemic hit at the beginning of 2020, Culpeper businesses had to adjust like so many, finding innovative ways to keep residents and visitors safe while keeping doors open. The Town had to get creative and embrace alternative methods for community development.

To that end, the Town of Culpeper Department of Tourism developed a Parklet Program to create outdoor spaces that serve as a community front porch.

Parklets are small outdoor areas along Culpeper's most walkable streets that extend the sidewalks and create space for amenities like seating, landscaping, art, and more. Taking up one to two on-street parking spaces, they feature café tables surrounded by safety fencing as well as beautifully curated flower boxes, umbrellas to provide shade, or other comforts.

These public spaces take advantage of the dynamic energy that already flows along Culpeper's downtown streets, offering a new way to experience them. Parklets are not a new concept, but rather an established tool in urban placemaking. They bring a casual, comfortable living room feel outdoors.

These parklets also show Culpeper's commitment to being a safe destination for tourists, a place where people can come spend a long weekend where the noise and chaos of crowded streets fade away, and they can reconnect with what truly matters.

In addition, parklets offer financial benefits for the business partners nearest them, and the town as a whole, by giving the public beautiful and comfortable places to support

restaurants and businesses. They increase foot traffic and improve the pedestrian experience.

The parklets are an important part of local businesses' phased approach to reopening fully to the public. As Culpeper businesses take every precaution necessary to keep everyone safe, parklets give another option for outdoor experiences as well as social distancing.

Currently, the parklets can be found in five locations on and near



Davis Street. There's one tucked away by Piedmont Steakhouse, and another in front of Poppy & Chalk—perfect for enjoying an ice cream from Scoop on Davis in the back of the vintage shop. A larger parklet has taken up residence in front of Raven's Nest Coffeehouse, allowing multiple groups to enjoy a morning latte or fresh-baked lunch in the sunshine. The last two are situated in front of Pinto Thai and The Frenchmen's Corner.

However, the beauty of these semi-permanent spaces is the ability to move them around to wherever makes sense—allowing the Town of Culpeper to place the parklets in front of different businesses from time to time, creating a new flow of energy and activity that feels fresh.

The turbulence of 2020 taught us many things—one is the value of a great outdoor space. That's an idea that isn't going anywhere, making the parklets a valuable addition to downtown that will continue.
