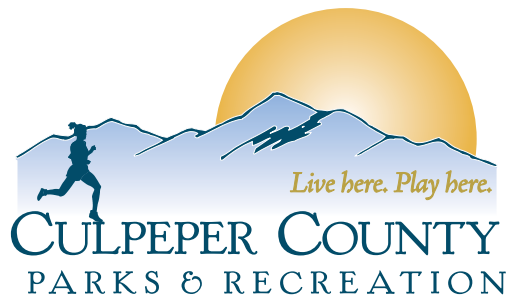

win for the citizens of Culpeper County.” He also praised the Culpeper County Board of Supervisors for their leadership during these challenging times which allowed the County to move forward with this project.

Laura Loveday encapsulated the true intent and goal of the Culpeper County Fieldhouse with just one poignant statement, “this facility will be inclusive for everyone, it will be accessible for everyone, it will have something to offer everyone, and we want each and every resident to find something to love about the Fieldhouse and visit it over and over again.”
