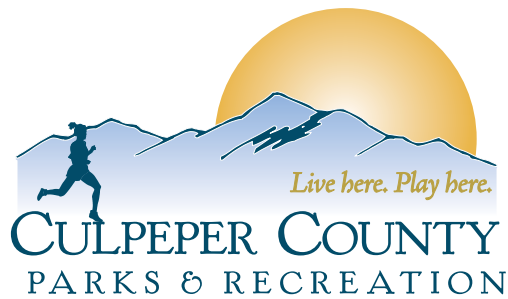

AQUATICS

Swim lessons are Monday-Thursday for 2 weeks (8 classes total). Fridays are make up days. For more detailed swim lesson descriptions, please visit website.

Infant/Toddler

Ages 6-36months, 8days

Prerequisites: Adult must get in water with child

This is the perfect way to introduce your little one to the water. This class will teach proper supports and holds, water safety, basic skills, and will have games to encourage participation.

Preschool I

Ages 3-5, 8days

Prerequisites: Must be able to willing leave parent, participate in a group and follow directions.

No previous experience. This class will help your child adjust to the water, teach water safety, entry, and introduce floating and breathing.

Preschool II

Ages 3-5, 8days

Prerequisites: Preschool I certificate or be able to submerge face, blow bubbles, front glide and float on front and back.

This class will increase child's skills with the back float and recovery, and introduce locomotion skills—arm and leg action on front and back.

Preschool III

Ages 3-5, 8days

Prerequisites: Preschool II certificate or glide on front and back for 2 body lengths, roll, and recover to vertical. Swim using arms and legs for 3 body lengths.

Your preschooler is ready, with guided help, to get those legs and arms moving at the same time to swim!

Level I

Ages 6+, 8days

Prerequisites: Must be able and willing leave parent, participate in a group and follow directions.

For the individual that doesn't swim or can just barley swim. This is the class to help you feel comfortable in the water and to enjoy the water safely. Entering and exiting the water safely, learning to submerge mouth, nose and eyes, and breath control, front and back float and recovering to a stand, changing direction in the water, swimming 5 yards on front and back.

Level II

Ages 6+, 8days

Prerequisites: Level I Certificate or be able to enter water, travel 5 yards, submerge face 5 times, front glide 2 body lengths, roll to back and float 5 seconds, recover to vertical.

Class focuses on fundamental skills: Entering water by stepping or jumping in from the side, submerging entire head, blowing bubbles, open eyes underwater, front and back glide, swim on front and back 5 body lengths, floating without support, locomotion skills and alternating arm and leg action.

Level III

Ages 6+, 8days

Prerequisites: Level II Certificate Or be able to step into chest deep water, tread water 15 seconds, swim 5 body lengths using combined arms and legs, front and back float 15 seconds.

For the individual that is able to swim, this class will focus on adding to your skills. Class will cover: survival float, elementary backstroke, coordinate front crawl. Intro to scissor and dolphin kick, and fundamentals of treading.

Level I - Teen/Adult

Ages 13+, 8days

For the individual that doesn't swim or can just barely swim. This is the class to help you feel comfortable in the water and to enjoy the water safely. Entering and exiting the water safely, learning to submerge mouth, nose and eyes, and breath control, front and back float and recovering to a stand, changing direction in the water, swimming 5 yards on front and back.

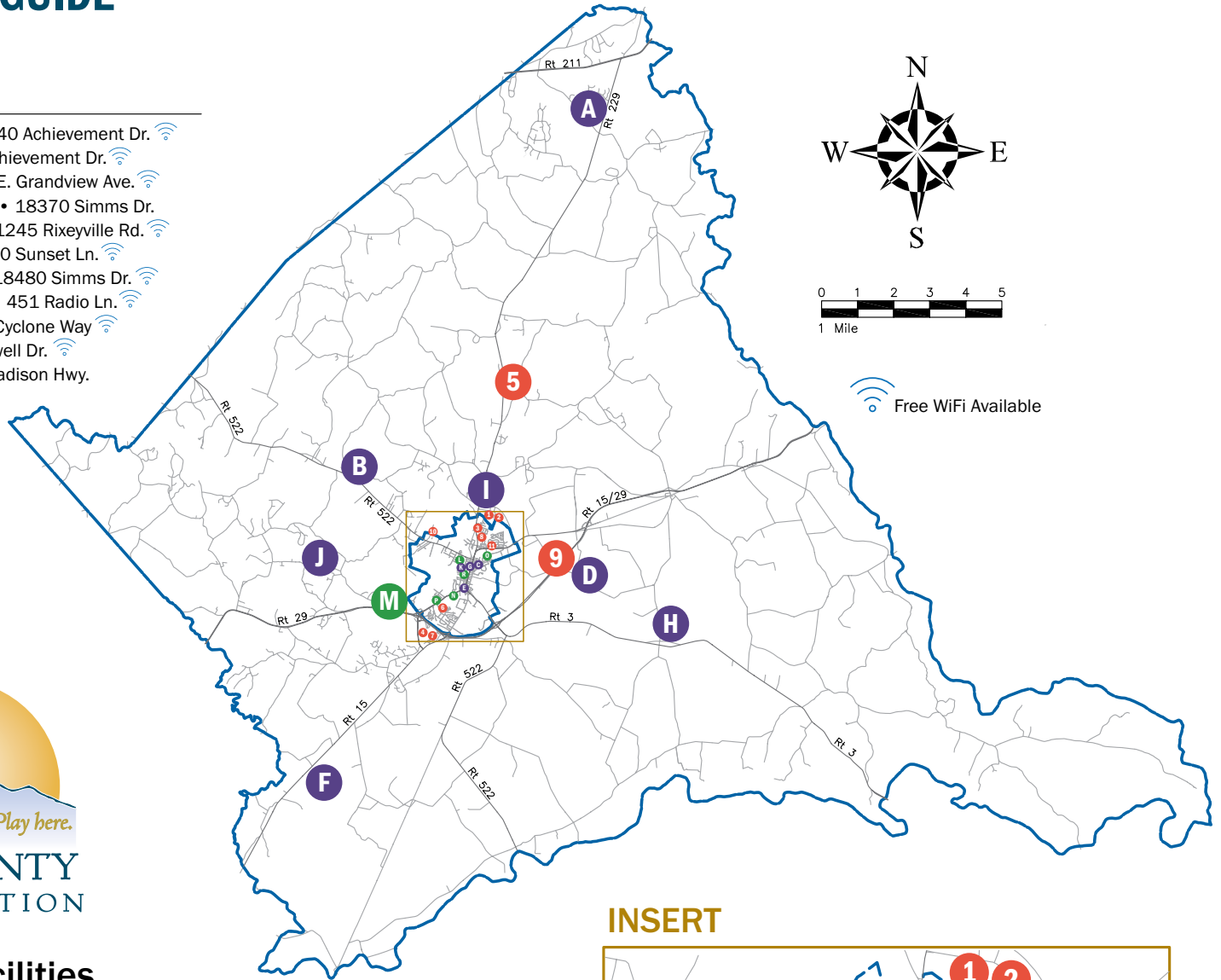

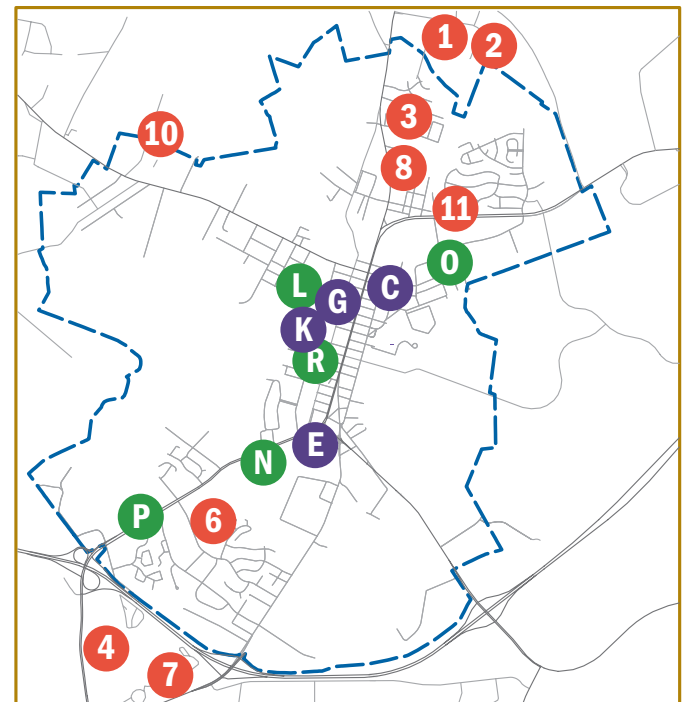
