New! ATHLETIC FIELD LIGHTING AT THE CULPEPER SPORTS COMPLEX

The future is looking brighter even at night for Culpeper County and the patrons of the Culpeper Sports Complex. This is because at the November 3, 2021 Board of Supervisors Meeting, the Board unanimously supported the plan to install athletic field lighting at the Culpeper Sports Complex, which was recommended by the Buildings & Grounds Committee. Committee Chairman Jack Frazier stated that, "athletic field lighting at the facility would be a great addition because the field lights would not only support our local Associations, but the County's efforts to recruit sports tourism and positively impact our local businesses."

Committee Chairman Jack Frazier went on to further explain that our community and local Associations desperately need field lights at the Sports Complex because Culpeper's coaches and kids are losing vital game and practice time throughout the year—especially during the Fall Season. As he remarked, "Culpeper County has a large population that commutes over an hour to work making it challenging, if not impossible, for individuals to attend a 5:30pm or 6:00pm practice/game time and this facility improvement will remove that barrier and create more opportunities for our participants and families."

The athletic field lighting plan proposes the installation of LED lighting on 5 baseball fields, 2 softball fields, 3 football fields, and 4 soccer fields. The project is funded in the County's Capital Improvements Plan for the current fiscal year and is scheduled to be completed by the Summer 2022.





Coming Soon! CULPEPER COUNTY FIELDHOUSE

On Tuesday, October 5, 2021 the Culpeper County Board of Supervisors unanimously approved the construction of the County's newest public facilitythe Culpeper County Fieldhouse. The Fieldhouse will be located within the Culpeper Sports Complex, 16358 Competition Dr., Culpeper, VA 22701 and will showcase over 16,000 SF of recreation and leisure space.


