Culpeper County Fieldhouse FAQs

How do I find the schedule of events for the gymnasium?

Schedules will be posted monthly for the gymnasium on our Facebook Account (Culpeper County Parks & Recreation) as well as on our website, culpeperrecreation.com. Check back frequently for updates and any changes.

I want to drop my child off at the Fieldhouse, is this okay?

Ages 10–12 may use designated areas of the facility provided their parent/guardian is on the premises (Inside Fieldhouse/Onsite of complex) and they have completed a facility orientation with their parent/ guardian.

Ages 13+ may use the Culpeper County Fieldhouse without adult supervision, unless posted otherwise.

Ages 16+ may be considered the supervising guardian for siblings age 12 and younger when using the Culpeper County Fieldhouse, provided responsible and appropriate behavior is exercised at all at times.

Children must be picked up at least 15 minutes prior to the building closing.

What does the membership include?

With a membership, patrons of the Culpeper County Fieldhouse will have unlimited access to select monthly programs and activities within the gymnasium.

Programs include: pickleball, youth basketball, youth volleyball, 13+ volleyball, 50+ basketball, home school, men's 18+ basketball, men's 30+ basketball, badminton, youth futsal, adult futsal, co-ed adult basketball, and more.

Can adults participate in youth specific times? Can youth participate in adult specific times?

Some activities will be designated for certain age groups and others will be "open" for all to participate. This measure is put into place to gauge appropriate competition and maintain safety. Adults are not permitted to participate in youth sports and youth are not permitted to participate in adult sports.

Do I need to have my own sports equipment for the gymnasium?

The Culpeper County Fieldhouse will have limited equipment available for use. Patrons are encouraged to bring their own equipment with their name written on it in permanent marker.



Can I rent the Fieldhouse for a private event?

Yes, the entire Fieldhouse or parts of the Fieldhouse can be rented for private rentals. There are specific rental times built into the Fieldhouse schedule.

Can I bring in outside food or drinks into the Fieldhouse?

Bottled water, sports drinks, coffee, and/or tea must be in non-breakable containers. Food and soda are not permitted within the Gymnasium

Do you have sports leagues?

Culpeper County Parks & Recreation will offer leagues at multiple times throughout the year. Participants must be registered prior to the league to take part in the program.

Are there lockers available for valuables?

A limited number of lockers are available for patron use when participating in events at the Fieldhouse at no charge. Items may not be left in lockers overnight.

Special Olympics has provided year round sports training and athletic competition in a variety of Olympic-type sports for children and adults with intellectual disabilities since its founding in 1968. The focus of Special Olympics is to provide athletes with continuous opportunities for physical fitness, friendships, and mentorships.



Each year, Special Olympics holds nearly 2,000 competitions for youth and adults at no cost to the participant. Anyone with an intellectual disability who is eight years or older can participate in Special Olympics! Ages 2–7 can also participate in the Young Athletes program, which is a program geared towards younger athletes both **with and without** intellectual disabilities. Participants enjoy a mix of play and sport activities that work on motor skills like balance, flexibility, and coordination.

Culpeper was in a pickle. The fastest growing sport in America—pickleball—was at its doorstep, and hundreds of passionate players were running out of court space.

The department officially opened four spectacularly dazzling courts, on top of a well-manicured hill with gorgeous views of Mountain Run Lake.

"It's an eleven!" gushed George Shackleford, one of the driving forces behind the push for the new courts, who spoke during the grand opening ceremony at Mountain Run Lake Park on October 22.

Andrew Hardy, parks and rec director, opened the ceremony to christen the new courts on a picturesque autumn morning—tailor-made for the dozens of picklers on hand, anxiously waiting to volley. Hardy thanked the Culpeper Board of Supervisors, including Chairman Gary M. Deal and Tom Underwood, both who offered remarks, for their overwhelming support and approval for the \$192,288.00 project.

Culpeper Pickleball's Amy Hinson applauded the efforts of several Culpeper residents whose joint dedication and vision made the courts a reality. Hinson has been an ambassador for Culpeper Pickleball, having pioneered the town's first non-sanctioned mixed-couples tournament in June.

"The Culpeper County Board of Supervisors and Department of Parks and Recreation has provided our



community with the prettiest pickleball venue in all of Virginia," Hinson proudly stated. "We at Culpeper Pickleball could not be more excited to bring pickleball programs to our community."

The local artist who designed an original logo to coincide with the debut of the new courts agrees. "The courts look beautiful and play even better," said Antony Rozwadowski, whose logo was everywhere, on shirts in all the primary colors. "You can't beat the layout overseeing the lake and trees. What a great mix of players, smiles, and fun this morning!"

The four new pickleball courts are conveniently situated near the park's playground, restrooms and dog park. The town transferred ownership of the out-of-town park to the county late last year.

Games are played on a surface comparable in size to a badminton court, either in a singles or doubles format. A perforated polymer ball—lime green is the favorite—is volleyed over a net. Game is to 11, win by two.


