

Dear Citizens,

I hope that everyone has had a wonderful summer. It has gone by quickly and schools will soon be back in session, so please be mindful of school children and school buses in your travels. As a reminder, watch for buses and stop when they are loading and unloading students. All buses are now equipped with cameras, and citations will be issued for any violations which occur. Speaking of schools, we are fortunate to have a great team of professionals here at our Culpeper County Public Schools. The continuous improvements to our schools, the programs offered, and the student experience that we are able to provide have not gone unnoticed. For example, the Culpeper Technical Education Center (CTEC) regularly hosts tours for other school districts and private companies from throughout the State. Culpeper County is proud to be able to fund not only the schools, but parks and recreation and so many other things that add to the excellent quality of life in Culpeper.

On the subject of Parks and Recreation, I am especially proud to share that the Culpeper County Fieldhouse is fully operational and being utilized well by our community. In a recent presentation to the Board of Supervisors we learned that in the past operational year, 19,449 people visited the Fieldhouse. Community members participating in programs hosted by Parks and Recreation made up 5,043 of those visitors. Our Access Assistance Program can help if program fees are a challenge for you or your family. Culpeper County Parks & Recreation strives to serve as many County residents as possible and we have been lucky to have received donations that help us to reach and maintain that goal.

We are also proud to have been chosen as the host for both Rugby and Little League State Championships. This has a significant positive economic impact on our community as families from across the state make their way to Culpeper to participate. Be on the lookout for several more statewide events being hosted in Culpeper this fall. Additionally, watch out for upcoming tennis and basketball camps we conduct through our Parks and Rec Department. The fee is \$10 which includes a shirt. We could not operate these camps without our volunteers.



This year's tour will be held Saturday, September 16th and Sunday, September 17th from 10am-4pm both days. Fun for all ages, the tour will showcase both traditional and unique farms in the beautiful Blue Ridge foothills that make up Culpeper County. The event provides a wonderful educational experience and includes an array of hands-on activities and demonstrations. The 15 carefully selected farms and ag-related businesses on the tour reflect Culpeper's unique agricultural industry and the millions of dollars in production, wages, and salaries generated in the county and state.

The tour, a self-guided driving experience, can be started at the Welcome Center located at Culpeper Agricultural Enterprises on Route 29, or any of the participating farms. TO STOP ILLEGAL PASSINGS AND KEEP KIDS SAFE CCPS EXPANDS BUS CAMERA PROGRAM

Culpeper County Public Schools (CCPS) has expanded its bus camera program through a partnership with BusPatrol, the leading stop-arm enforcement technology provider with a school bus safety program to reduce the number of times motorists illegally pass school buses and put children at risk. BusPatrol is a safety technology company that aims to make the journey to and from school safer for children. by changing driver behavior and creating a culture of awareness and responsibility around school buses. In addition, they provide accessibility for school districts and municipalities to modernize their entire school bus fleets by outfitting them with the latest stop-arm, route planning, and route execution technology.

CCPS Division Superintendent Dr. Tony Brads said, "With the support of the Culpeper County Sheriff's Office, the Commonwealth's Attorney and the County Attorney, Culpeper County Public Schools has been a leader in the Commonwealth in terms of protecting our students by being one of the first school divisions to deploy stop arm cameras."

Through this program CCPS school buses have been modernized with



advanced safety technology, including Al-powered cameras to capture the license plates of vehicles that violate school bus stopping laws. The technology, installation, and maintenance are provided at no cost to the school district or taxpayer through BusPatrol's violator-funded program. Kate Spree, a spokesperson for Bus-

Patrol, said: "Every day, thousands of motorists illegally pass stopped school buses, with zero thought to the children whose lives they put at risk. We are proud to join forces with Culpeper County Public Schools to help make roads safer for students."

The CCPS program started with a pilot program in 2018 that only included a few buses. "Our small-scale program served as a deterrent to stop arm violations. However, violations proved to be problematic on many other bus routes. This expansion of our bus camera program with BusPatrol greatly increases coverage and consistency for the overall safety of our students and adds a level of reassurance for all our drivers," Dr. Brads explained. The fleetwide implementation was complete in May 2023 so all of our buses are equipped with this safety feature to start the 2023-2024 school year.

In conjunction with the expansion, CCPS has developed a bus safety page on the website and launched a public awareness campaign to educate motorists about school bus safety laws. The CCPS Bus Safety webpage can be found at https://www.culpeperschools.org/o/ccps/page/bus-safety or by clicking on Bus Safety in the "Community Links" section at the bottom of the main CCPS page.

Other Virginia school divisions who partner with BusPatrol are Gloucester County Public Schools, Newport News Public Schools, and Williamsburg-James City County Public Schools.



According to Virginia DMV, drivers must:

- stop for stopped school buses with flashing red lights and an extended stop sign when approaching from any direction
- remain stopped until everyone is clear and the bus moves again
- stop whenever the bus is loading or unloading passengers, even if the lights and stop sign are not activated

If a school bus is on the opposite side of a median or barrier, motorists aren't required to stop; however, drivers should be prepared for students exiting the school bus and crossing into their lanes.

Who Are Stop-Arm Violation Tickets Issued to, and How Much Will They Cost Violators?

Stop-arm cameras identify illegal passers by license plate number. Tickets are issued to a vehicle's registered owner unless the automobile is proven stolen during the offense. If someone other than the vehicle's owner was driving at the time, the owner can request a transfer of liability.

In Virginia, a first-time stop-arm violation carries a fine of \$250. In addition to the financial deterrent, violators learn about the potential dangers of their actions. Offenders can call the program's toll-free number and speak with a representative, who can review the video evidence and help them understand the dangers of illegal passing. Services are offered in both English and Spanish.

Data from other safety programs demonstrate that 98% of first-time offenders do not receive a second ticket, and 95% of drivers do not contest their ticket after seeing video evidence of their violation.

From the dinosaurs who walked the earth, to Culpeper's role in our country's founding and the ongoing struggle for equal rights, to the challenges of an ever-changing modern world, Culpeper has a story to tell. Find your story at the Museum of Culpeper History!

The Museum of Culpeper History is a non-profit 501(c)(3) organization that collects, preserves, interprets, and promotes the history of Culpeper by engaging and educating diverse audiences with our collections to create an increased understanding of the significant historical events that formed the community we know today. The museum's goal is to tell the stories of all Culpeper residents by highlighting our community's shared past through our exhibits and programs. Our core values of education, stewardship, community, integrity, and preservation guide our efforts.

Located in downtown Culpeper's historic

train depot adjacent to the Culpeper Visitor Center, the museum is open seven days a week from 10AM-4PM. Admission is free for all Culpeper County residents and all children under the age of 18.

TOURS & PROGRAMS

Guided Tours

Guided tours for adult or school groups may be scheduled by calling the Museum's Education Coordinator at (540) 829-1749. Tours can be customized to suit your group's interests and time constraints. Home school groups, after-school groups, scout groups and clubs are all invited to experience the Museum through a specialized tour. A minimum of two weeks advance notice is required. A program fee is charged for guided tours. *Walking Tours*

The museum leads a number of tours of historic areas in the town and county of Culpeper. Group walking tours are available on request subject to the museum's schedule and the availability of its staff and volunteers. Minimum group size is 7 people; maximum group size is 14. Two weeks advance notice is required and a program fee is charged.

Little Learners

Little Learners is the museum's interactive series of children's programming that brings fun facts, objects, and activities out of the past to your family today! The series, targeted at ages 2-5, will be held monthly. Each month will feature a different craft inspired by local history. Past programs have included flying kites, drawing maps, and making your own dinosaur tracks! Programs are offered the third Thursday of the month. Admission to this program is FREE thanks to funding from the Rappahannock Electric Cooperative through a Power of Change grant.



- August 17 Jobs What do you want to be when you grow up? Come learn about different jobs and then make a hat to take home.
- September 21 Dinosaurs This month we will learn all about dinosaurs. Participants will get to make their own dino fossil to take home.
- October 19 Maps X marks the spot! Come learn about maps and then make one to take home.
- November 16 Native Americans This month we will learn about Native Americans. Participants will get to make their own clay pot.

Hands on History

Hands on History is the museum's new monthly series of weekend programs for everyone. Each month will feature a different activity that puts you in touch with Culpeper's past! All ages welcome! Programs will be offered afternoons of the second Saturday of the month, 1:00-3:00 PM. Drop in anytime!

- August 12 Say cheese! Learn about the history of photography and different types of photographs. Try your hand at taking some pictures.
- September 9 Digging up the past! Learn about what archeologists do and how an archeological dig works. Try your hand at digging up some artifacts.
- October 14 An apple a day keeps the doctor away! Learn about medicine from the past and what doctors did to help people who were sick.
 Try your hand at bandaging up a patient.
- November 11 Ready, Aim, Fire! Learn about weapons from the Revolutionary and Civil Wars. Try your hand at "shooting" targets.



The Brandy Station Foundation



The Brandy Station Foundation is a non-profit 501 (c) (3) all-volunteer community organization dedicated to preserving the natural and historic resources of the Brandy Station area of Culpeper County. GRAFFITI HOUSE TOURS



The Brandy Station Foundation operates the Graffiti House at 19484 Brandy Road in Brandy Station which contains Civil War graffiti and a museum. The Graffiti House is a two-story frame structure built in 1858. We like to say that the walls of the house "talk"; they contain inscriptions, drawings, messages, and signatures of both Union and Confederate soldiers, hence the name "Graffiti House." Graffiti House hours and information about tours by appointment are posted on our website, www.brandystationfoundation.com. Admission is free, but donations are welcome.

Culpeper County Volunteer Fire & Rescue Association Firefighter I and II Graduating Class of 2023


