




A Message from the Board of Supervisors

Dear Citizens:

As summer has arrived, we wish everyone well and hope that you enjoy the season. We hope that everyone is happy and healthy. I will get right to County business and let you know that the fiscal year 2024 Budget was adopted on May 2nd. The budget commences July 1, 2023 and runs through June 30, 2023. The budget increased this year, to \$231,233,943. The budget includes some important capital improvement projects and fully funds the Culpeper County Public Schools' request. This was a reassessment year, and with property values increasing substantially, the Board lowered the real estate tax rate of 0.55 to 0.46. Full equalization would have been 0.44. This is the lowest tax rate in the region by far. We lowered the personal property tax rate for personal vehicles last year to \$3.00, and this will remain in effect this year. Personal property tax rates are all remaining flat. The projected fund balance will be approximately 14.4% of the total operational budget, which is well within County financial policy. I am happy to say that the County is very fiscally healthy.

In addition to the good news on budget and tax rates, the Board is proud of a number of projects which are coming to fruition. The public swimming pool project being funded by the Town of Culpeper is in the design phase and construction is expected to begin early next year. Improvements to The Carver Center are also continuing. The Culpeper Cooperative Extension offices are now located in their newly renovated space and a new roof for the main building is now funded. The County has been able to complete many significant initiatives over the last couple of years, which we are proud of and hope that you are too. The Public Works Committee of the Board is working diligently on plans for future road improvements, and it appears that VDOT will fund two Smart Scale projects in this year's round of applications. One will be a traffic circle at Routes 229 and 621, and the other is a partial R-cut improvement at the intersection of Routes 3 and 669. Keep in mind that these projects will not occur for several years, but the funding source appears to be coming, although not finalized.

There will be many community events this summer, and there have been many already during the spring. Keep an eye out for the activities and events that are going on and enjoy some recreational opportunities—our community is thriving! School is out, so drive carefully and watch for children. We hope that everyone has an excellent summer. On behalf of the Board, I invite you to let us know anytime that you have concerns, comments or suggestions. The Board and the County staff are here to assist you.

Salem Volunteer Fire Department



For 44 years, the Salem Volunteer Fire Department has proudly served Culpeper County by answering calls for assistance with fire and emergency medical service needs of all types. With the new gaming opportunities in Virginia, and the onset of COVID, it became apparent that bingo as a fundraiser was no longer viable. Therefore, we had to develop new fundraising ideas for 2022 and beyond. The department held (8) eight dances, a car show, a golf tournament, a drag show, both a residential and corporate mailout campaign and our annual Santa Breakfast.

We want to have even more different fundraising and community events for 2023. The department relies on fundraising events, donations from the community and grants to be able to purchase lifesaving equipment to put back into our community. In 2022, the Salem Volunteer Fire Department was awarded two (2) grants. A grant was received from REC which was used to purchase four (4) thermal imaging cameras and from the LOEB Foundation to replace our outdated Canteen Unit.

In May 2022, we purchased a 2004 E-One Rescue Engine from the Marshall Volunteer Fire & Rescue Department. Rescue Engine 8 officially went into the service in early December. It is utilized for fire suppression and carries extrication equipment. The Rescue Engine is a great addition to our emergency services fleet.

We take pride in being a part of the Culpeper landscape and contributing to our community.

From the dinosaurs who walked the earth, to Culpeper's role in our country's founding and the ongoing struggle for equal rights, to the challenges of an ever-changing modern world, Culpeper has a story to tell. Find your story at the Museum of Culpeper History!

The Museum of Culpeper History is a nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization that collects, preserves, interprets, and promotes the history of Culpeper by engaging and educating diverse audiences with our collections to create an increased understanding of the significant

historical events that formed the community we know today. The museum's goal is to tell the stories of all Culpeper residents by highlighting our community's shared past through our exhibits and programs. Our core values of education, stewardship, community, integrity, and preservation guide our efforts.

Located in downtown Culpeper's historic train depot adjacent to the Culpeper Visitor Center, the museum is open seven days a week from 10AM-4PM. Admission is free for all County residents and all children under the age of 18.

TOURS & PROGRAMS

Guided Tours

Guided tours for adult or school groups may be scheduled by calling the Museum's Education Coordinator at (540) 829-1749. Tours can be customized to suit your group's interests and time constraints. Home school groups, after-school groups, scout groups and clubs are all invited to experience the Museum through a specialized tour. A minimum of two weeks advance notice is required. A program fee is charged for guided tours.

Walking Tours

The museum leads a number of tours of historic areas in the town and county of Culpeper. Group walking tours are available on request subject to the museum's schedule and the availability of its staff and volunteers. Minimum group size is 7 people; maximum group size is 14. Two weeks advance notice is required and a program fee is charged.

Little Learners

Little Learners is the museum's interactive series of children's programming that brings fun facts, objects, and activities out of the past to your family today! The series, targeted at ages 2-5, will be held monthly. Each month will feature a different craft inspired by local history. Past programs have included flying kites, drawing maps, and making your own dinosaur tracks! Programs are offered the third Thursday of the month. Admission to this program is FREE thanks to funding from the Rappahannock Electric Cooperative through a Power of Change grant.

June 15 – *All About Flags* – In honor of Flag Day, learn about flags past and present, from the local to national level. Then make one of your own to take home **July 20** – *Space, The Final Frontier* – This month we will learn all about the sun, moon, and stars as we explore space. Participants will get to paint their own celestial object.

Hands on History

Hands on History is the museum's new monthly series of weekend programs for family members of all ages. Each month will feature a different activity that puts you in touch with Culpeper's past! Programs will be offered mornings of the second Saturday of the month.

June 10 – Exhibit Design, The Making of a Museum – The museum is getting ready to create a new exhibit. Come see how it is done and get a chance to try designing your own.

July 8 – Show me the Money! – Money didn't always look the way it does today and was not the first way people paid for things. Learn about the evolution of money and try your hand at bartering for goods.

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

GRAFFITI HOUSE TOURS

The Brandy Station Foundation operates the Graffiti House at 19484 Brandy Road in Brandy Station which contains Civil War graffiti and a museum. The Graffiti House is a two-story frame structure built in 1858. We like to say that the walls of the house "talk"; they contain inscriptions, drawings, messages, and signatures of both Union and Confederate soldiers, hence the name "Graffiti House." Dive into swim lessons and aquatic events at Powell Wellness Center



Kids of all ages took part in the 2022 World's Largest Swim Lesson Event at Powell Wellness Center The indoor aquatic arena at Powell Wellness Center (PWC) is available to the public for swim lessons and a variety of special events for all ages.

Swim lessons: PWC offers group swim lessons year-round in its indoor aquatic arena. Red Cross-certified water safety instructors teach group, private and semi-private lessons for children and private lessons for adults. For children,

group lessons include Parent & Child, Preschool level (ages 3-5) and Learn to Swim level (ages 6-13). Lesson sessions are typically offered quarterly; the next session begins in June.

The American Academy of Pediatrics recommends swim lessons for children as a "layer of protection" to prevent drowning. Drowning is the leading cause of injury death in US children 1 to 4 years of age and the third leading cause of unintentional injury death among US children and adolescents 5 to 19 years of age. In addition to supporting water safety, swim lessons introduce children to a physical activity that they may enjoy for years to come, points out PWC aquatics manager Stacey Aucoin.


Aquatic events: As with swim lessons, PWC's aquatic events are offered

year-round. These events are open to the public at no charge or for a small fee. Winter/spring events have included a Mardi Gras river parade and an Easter Egg float. "Kids absolutely love floating on tubes or noodles around our river oval, and catching Mardi Gras beads or plucking Easter eggs out of the water definitely adds to the excitement," says Aucoin. The aquatics staff will be in costume for a Halloween event where kids and their accompanying adults enjoy a swim or float through a floating pumpkin patch.

In May, PWC's aquatics staff recognizes Water Safety Month by sharing tips and holding a coloring contest that encourages kids to submit an illustration of their favorite water safety tip. On June 22, PWC will be part of the worldwide World's Largest Swim Lesson and will host a free introductory lesson for children. In November, PWC opens its aquatic fitness classes to the public as part of the worldwide Aquathon event highlighting the benefits, variety and fun of exercising in the water.

Aucoin emphasizes that aquatic exercise is low impact and accessible to all levels of fitness. PWC currently offers a dozen aquatic classes, as well as family swim sessions and aqua volleyball for center members and their guests. Multi-week aquatic programs addressing specific needs such as back support or knee health are open to the public. "Anyone interested in learning more about our aquatic fitness offerings is welcome to stop by for a tour and sample a class," invites Aucoin.
